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Flying Geese Tutorial

This is a simple tutorial for making traditional flying geese units.

For each unit, you will need 1 rectangle and 2 squares. Flying geese units are always twice as wide as they are tall.

Calculate the size of your fabric pieces:

Determine the width and height you'd like your unit to **finish** at.

(Remember the height has to be half the width.)

Add $\frac{1}{2}$ " to each measurement, giving you the unfinished width (w) and height (h) of your sections.

Using fabrics of your choice, **cut:**

one rectangle w x h

two squares h x h



Lay one square right side down on the rectangle and stitch a diagonal seam.



Trim the seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ ".



Press the seam toward the triangle.



Lay the remaining triangle right side down and stitch diagonally.



Trim the seam allowance to 1/4".



Press toward the triangle.



There you go!

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
