# Sand & Surf

a twiddletails pattern

## General information

This pattern provides instructions for a baby quilt and an alternate layout for a lap quilt.

Fabric quantities are based on 100% cotton fabric 44"-45" wide from selvedge to selvedge.

Seam allowances are ¼" unless noted otherwise.

Finished quilt: 35" x 48"








Finished block: 4" x 8"

## Helpful tools

## Gather your Materials

Moda Bella Solids in the following colors:

BG		9900-97	Bleached White PFD	2 yds
A		9900-107	Turquoise	½ yd
B		9900-216	Peacock	½ yd
C		9900-85	Robin's Egg	¾ yd
D		9900-104	Hay	½ yd
E		9900-68	Fig Tree Wheat	½ yd
F		9900-201	Sand	¼ yd

½ yard binding fabric

2 ½ yards backing fabric (3 ½ yds for lap quilt)

39" x 52" batting (52" x 68" for lap quilt)

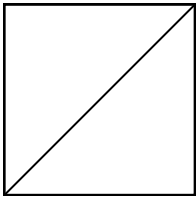
## Cut the fabric

Fabric	$4\frac{7}{8}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ "	$9\frac{1}{4}$ " x $9\frac{1}{4}$ "
BG	48	12
F	8	0
A, B, D, E	8	2
C	12 *(16)	3 *(4)

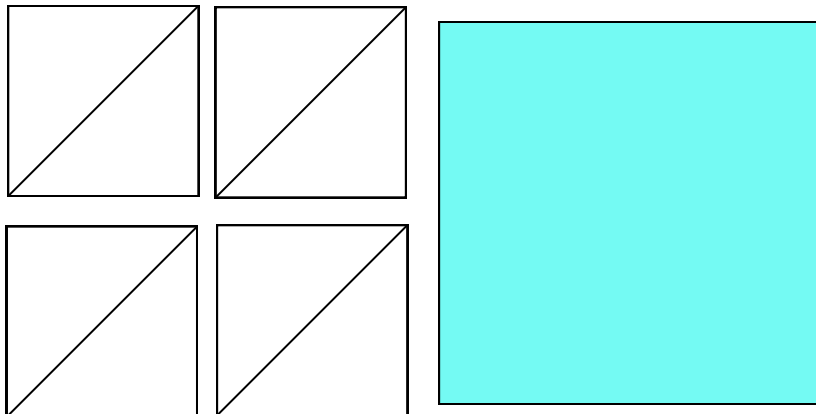
## Make the blocks

- 1** Using a pencil or washable marker, draw a diagonal line corner to corner on the **WRONG SIDE** of each  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " square.



- 2** Pair up 4 small ( $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " ) BG squares with each large ( $9\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{4}$ " ) colored square.

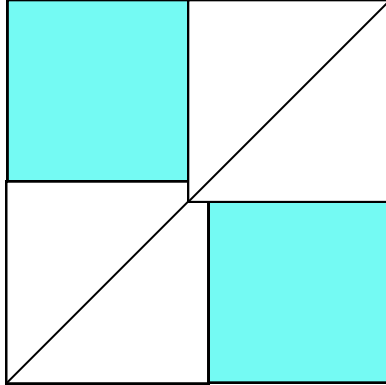
- 3** Pair up 4 small ( $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " ) colored squares with each large ( $9\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{4}$ " ) BG square.



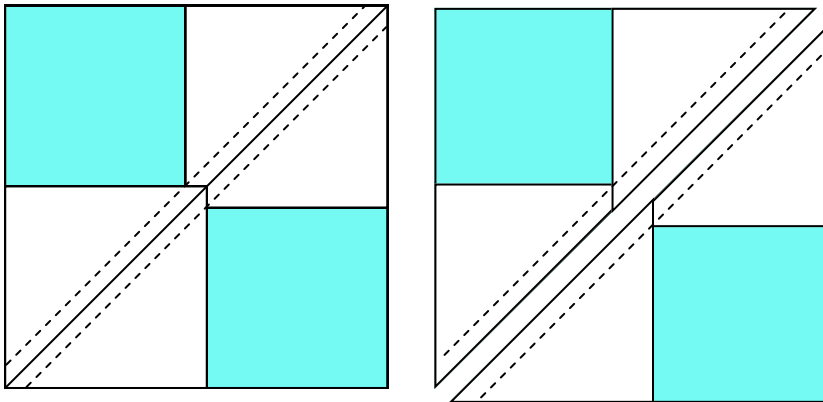
- 4** Out of each 5 square set (four  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " and one  $9\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{4}$ " ), make 4 flying geese units as follows.

# Make the Flying Geese Units

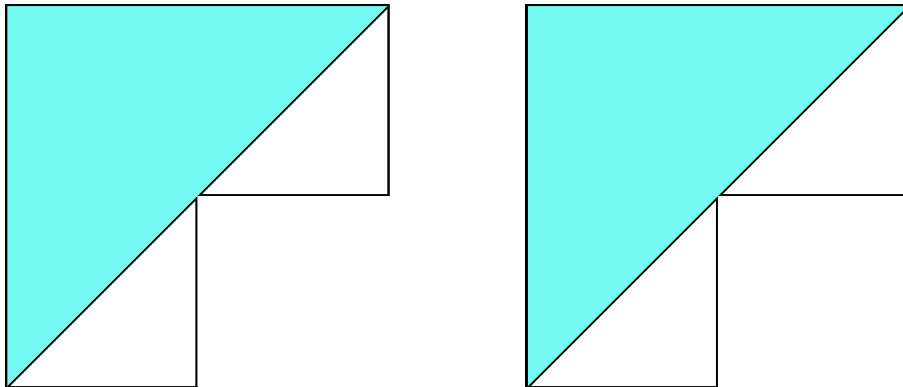
- 1** Place two small squares on top of a large square, **RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER**, matching up the drawn lines.



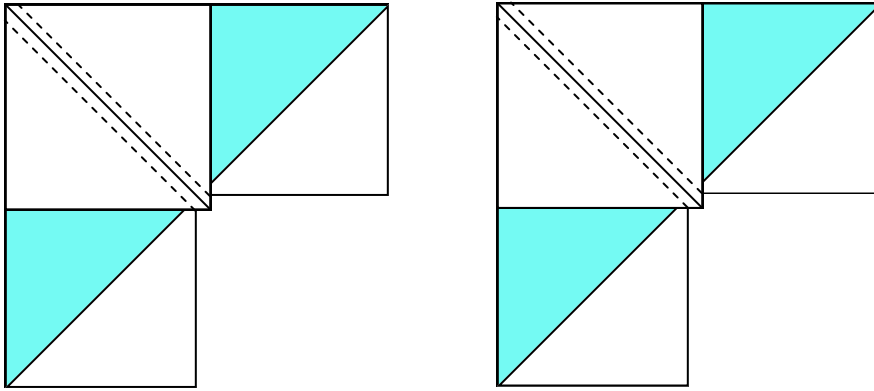
- 2** Sew a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the drawn line on both sides. Cut along the drawn line.



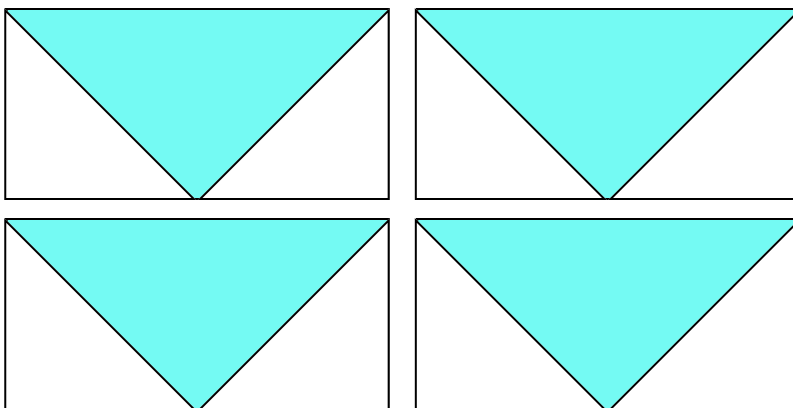
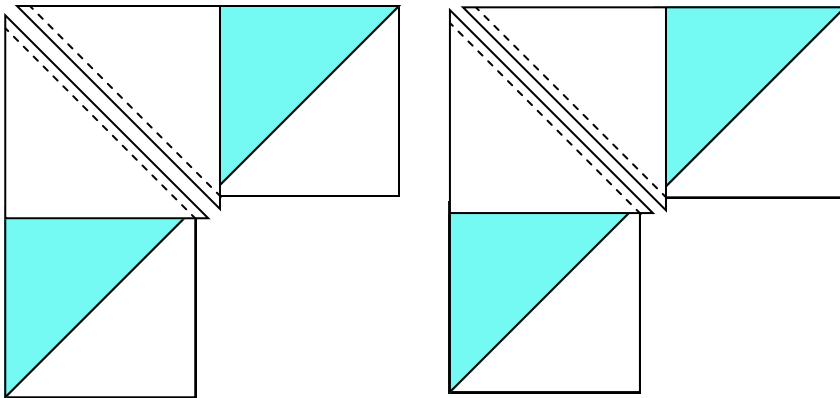
- 3** Cut along the drawn line and press toward the smaller triangles.



- 4** Lay one of the remaining small squares on top of each unit, **RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER** and sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the drawn line on both sides.

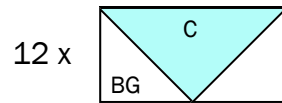
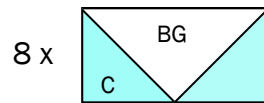
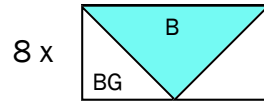
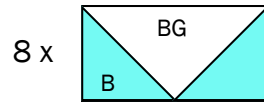
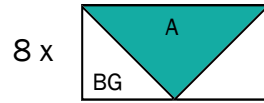
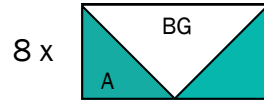


- 5** Cut along the drawn line and press seam toward the smaller triangles.

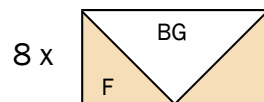
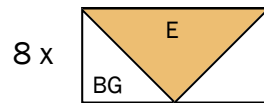
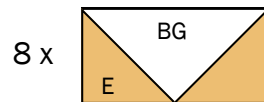
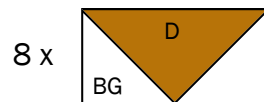
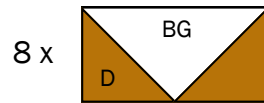


# Complete the Quilt Top

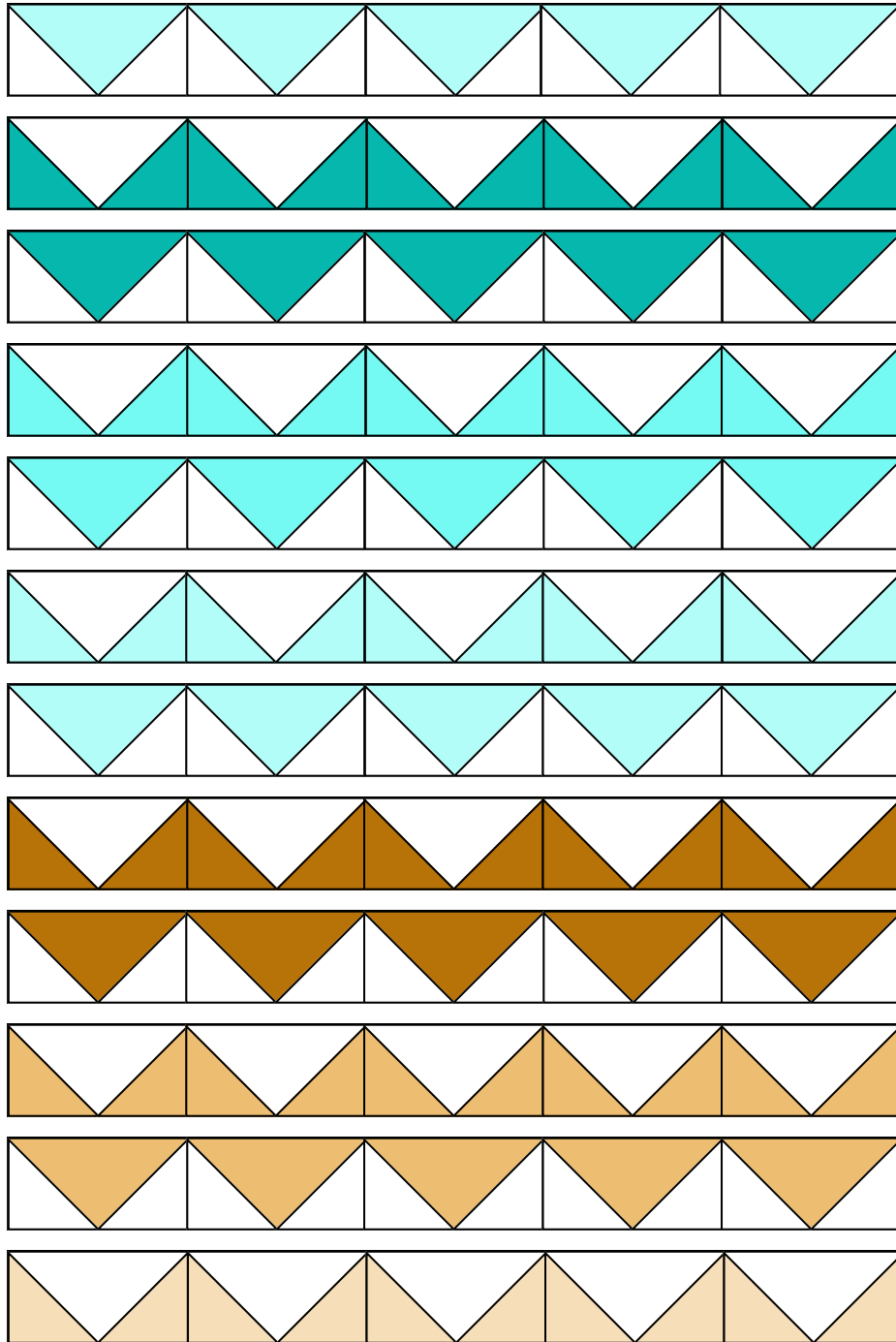
**1** You should now have flying geese units as follows:



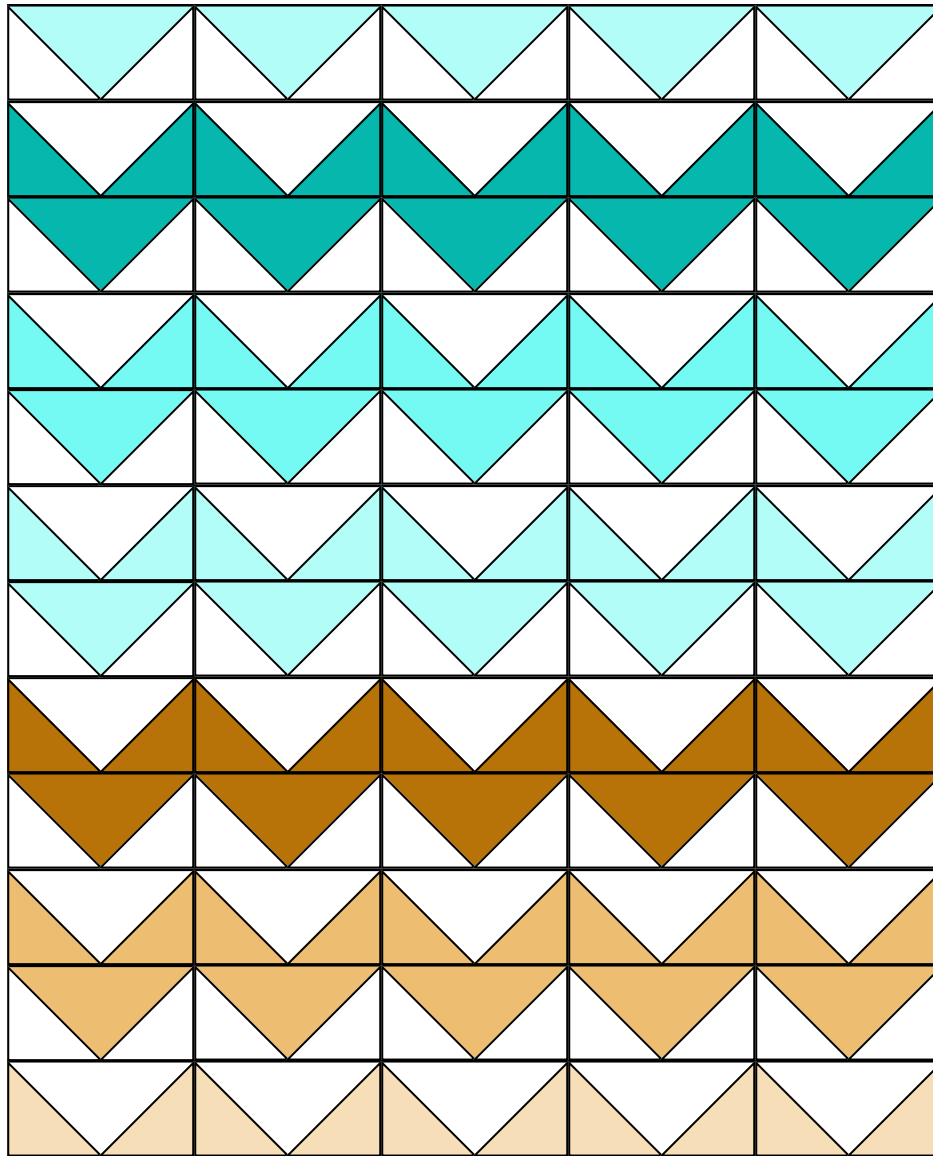
(16 if you're making the larger size)



- 2** Assemble blocks in rows as below. You will notice that you're not using all the blocks you made. See Page 9 for an alternate layout using all blocks.



**3** Sew the rows together.



## *Finish the Quilt*

- 1** Cut and piece the backing fabric to be 2" wider on each side than the quilt top. Press seam allowances open.
- 2** Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Baste.
- 3** Quilt as desired.
- 4** Bind.
